Elsa Wilhemina Bley

March 10, 1903 - July 21, 1990


Elsa Bley was born in New York City, the only child of George and Sophie (Munch) Bley.

Her grandfather was a German immigrant and sculptor of architectural pieces. Her father owned and operated a Manhattan apothecary, and died when Elsa was still young.

Elsa studied at the Grand Central Art School and the Art Students League of New York, under George Luks and John Sloan. She and her mother moved to Scarsdale in 1932, where Elsa taught classes under the auspices of the Scarsdale Art Guild. She began summering in Dorset in 1938, and moved here permanently in 1945.

In Vermont, she became very active in the artist community. For four decades she taught art students in her home and at the Southern Vermont Art Center. She painted portraits, and rendered many local landscapes in watercolor.

When Elsa passed away, she bequeathed her home to the Dorset Historical Society, which moved into Bley House in 1991.


